Greenburger Associates, Inc., a literary agency founded by his father 80 years ago, representing many world renowned and best-selling authors including Dan Brown and Brad Thor. Most recently, Mr. Greenburger founded the Greenburger Center for Social and Criminal Justice, which advocates for reforms to the criminal justice system.

In addition to real estate and the arts, Mr. Greenburger is an avid tennis player. He resides in Manhattan with his wife Isabelle Autones and children Morgan, Noah, Julia and Claire.
